# Lesson 14 – Daniel 9:15-23 "Daniel's Prayer: Part 3"

#### 1. Introduction:

- a. Two weeks ago: v1-4: Daniel's Preparation for Prayer:
  - 1) The prophecy: *Read* Jer 25:11-12 and Jer 29:10-14
    - a) Jerusalem fell to Babylon in 605 B.C. when Daniel and his three friends were taken captive.
    - b) It is now 538 B.C., which means 67 years have passed.

#### 2) Daniel's reaction to the prophecy:

- a) Daniel took the 70 years literally and believed that there would be literal fulfillment. Therefore, Daniel realized that the time set by God for restoring His people back in the City of Jerusalem was rapidly approaching.
- b) Daniel realized that the Word of God would be fulfilled on the basis of prayer.
- c) Daniel recognized the need for confession of sin as a prelude to restoration.

# 3) v3-4: Daniel's Preparation for Prayer:

- a) "And I set my face unto the Lord God ..." = Daniel is turning away from other things to concentrate on his prayer to the Lord as evidenced by his:
  - 1- Fasting = turning away from the distraction of food and physical needs.
  - 2- Sackcloth = turning away from the distractions of appearances and airs.
  - 3- Ashes = was a token of self-abhorrence (to deem one's self unworthy) and humiliation.
- b) Daniel knew that effective prayer requires:
  - 1- A proper attitude of mind and heart:
    - a- Asking according to His will.
    - b- Asking for the right motive (righteously).
    - c- Asking with sincerity.
    - d- Asking from the heart.
    - e- Asking humbly.
  - 2- Belief in the Word of God.

- 3- Obedience to the Word of God.
- 4- Confession.
- 5- Repentance: Forgiveness comes only after repentance!!
- 6- Petition.

# b. Last week: v5-14: Daniel's Prayer of Confession:

1) v5: "We have sinned" = DISOBEDIENCE to God.

# 2) The cycle of sin:

- a) v5: "and have committed iniquity" 1st step = the sin leads to perversion.
- b) v5: "and have done wickedly" 2nd step = the perversion leads to wickedness.
- c) v5: "and have rebelled" 3rd step = wickedness leads to rebellion.

# 3) The result of sin: v7-12:

- a) Jerusalem's walls have been broken down, its houses burnt with fire, even the palaces of the king and nobles, and the temple of the Lord itself; and all its inhabitants destroyed, dispersed, or carried away captive.
- b) They have served the Babylonians for the past 70 years.
- 4) The solution to sin: v13-14:

We break the cycle of sin through CONFESSION and REPENTANCE.
